President's Message

Last month I asked you to fill in a questionnaire. While we didn't get a huge number of people to respond, I want to thank those who did for your honest and thoughtful comments. I appreciate your willingness to share your feedback and the time you took to give us some insights.

The results are as follows:

- **Question 1: In-person, Zoom only, or Hybrid Meetings**
Hybrid (in-person & zoom): 10
 In-person only: 6
 Online (Zoom only): 2
Conclusion: Hybrid was the clear winner.
- **Question 2: Day of the Week for in-person meetings**
 Friday Evening: 1: 3.45% * Monday Evening: 1: 3.45% * **Saturday Daytime: 7: 24.14% ***
Sunday Daytime: 6: 20.69% * Sunday Evening: 2: 6.90% * **Thursday Evening: 5: 17.24% ***
Tuesday Evening: 5: 17.24% * Wednesday Evening: 2: 6.90%
- **Conclusion: Saturday or Sunday daytime is preferred for in-person meetings, but not strongly, with Thursday and Tuesday evenings coming in a close second.**
- **Question 3: Day of the Week for zoom meetings**
 Friday Evening: 1 3.33% * Monday Evening: 2 6.67% * Saturday Daytime: 4 13.33%
 Saturday Evening: 1 3.33% * Sunday Daytime: 5 16.67% * Sunday Evening: 4 13.33%
 Thursday Evening: 4 13.33% * **Tuesday Evening: 6 20.00%** * Wednesday Evening: 3 10.00%
- **Conclusion: Tuesday evening was a narrow winner for zoom only meetings.**
- **Question 4: Times for in-person meetings**
During daylight hours only: 9 50.00% * Evening hours only: 5 27.78% * Either day or night: 4 22.22%
- **Conclusion: The clear preference is for only daylight hours.**
- **Question 5: Times for zoom meetings**
 During daylight hours only: **3 16.67% *** During evening hours (I work during the day): **5 27.78% ***
Either day or night (it makes no difference): 10 55.56%
- **Conclusion: For zoom only meetings, there is no clear preference for day or night.**

The last two questions asked for participants to answer in comments about whether they would be willing to take on a leadership role and what members would like to see for NCPA going forward into the future.

Regarding the leadership question, many people responded that they'd be willing to help, but not in a formalized way or just not at the moment, perhaps in the future. The second question about what people would like to see garnered some great feedback.

A snapshot of the feedback is as follows:

- Book Groups – to discuss different genres
- Social Activities – going out for drinks (no food) or a few people mentioned potlucks
- Resource Options – cover design and book editing
- Public Book Signings
- Speakers on useful writing topics
- Provide a forum for dialog (either on the NCPA website or Facebook)

Again, thank you to all those who participated. For those who didn't have the time to fill in the questionnaire, if you'd like to offer your comments, please email me or any of the board members. We'd love to hear from you. The Board will meet soon to discuss how to implement the suggestions we received. We'll let you know as soon as we have a plan in place.

Do You Know the Real Meaning Behind These Popular Sayings?

Tricky Plurals You Always Spell Wrong

As we all know (or at least should know), all plural words do NOT end with an "s." Why?

According to *Word Genius* (WG), some English words have different origins, thus the root language can often impact the usage.

- Per WG, if a noun ends in a single "f," there's a strong possibility that instead of adding an "s" you drop the "f" and add "-ves."
- "Wolf" becomes "wolves." "Calf" becomes "calves." "Loaf" becomes "loaves."

BUT - The exception to this exception is:

- If the word ends in a double "f" — that's a plural "s."
- "Cliffs," "cuffs," and "mastiffs" are all **regular plural nouns**.

There are too many to include all **irregular plural nouns**, but here are a few:

- Goose → Geese
- Fungus → Fungi
- Appendix → Appendices
- Ox → Oxen
- Deer → Deer (**Zero plural nouns are spelled the same in plural and singular forms.**)

Again, per WG: Where do these **irregular plurals** come from? Blame their "parents."

- Words like "fungus" and "appendix" come from Latin, and
- "goose" and "ox" have Germanic origins.

These words retain the plural rules from their original languages. English borrows so much from other languages that it's no surprise it has so many irregularities.

- Sometimes there isn't just one way to spell a plural. That can work in two ways — either it makes tricky plurals harder to grasp, or it makes them more flexible.

Sometimes the plural form of a word is outdated

- Take "roof." Under the "f" rule explained earlier, the plural should be "rooves." That actually was a commonly accepted use in English, and it's technically not wrong. It's just not what most people use in modern English.
- Instead, it's "roofs." **This word becomes irregular by following the regular plural convention.**

Animals are especially common in the world of irregular plural choices.

- Take your pick between "fish" and "fishes," "shrimp" and "shrimps." Spellcheck might pick one version over the other, but:
- both are technically correct.

Word Genius sends me an email or two every day. I waste a lot of time clearing spam and emails that I once thought I’d want to subscribe to. However, I always open and enjoy my emails from Word Genius. You can subscribe to get a word a day and I feel like I have actually learned a lot in the month or so of my free subscription. Some days, instead of a new word you get a mini quiz to test your vocab knowledge. I enjoy both the quizzes and new words. I even look forward to these emails on a daily basis.

Word of the Day: You don’t need to subscribe to enjoy Word Genius. The website also shows you daily words and has quizzes as well as more fun stuff to explore. Today’s word of the day is “noctambulate,” for example. Fascinatingly enough, WordPress underlines it as incorrect! It means ‘to walk outside at night.’ Word Genius shows the word in a sentence, tells you about the popularity of the word in history and you can hear it being pronounced correctly. Apparently, it was the most popular in the 1950s, but I say we should bring noctambulate back!

Daily Quizzes: Other than daily new words, Word Genius also offers daily quizzes. These quizzes are great because they give you a lot of information. You do need to subscribe to play, but I definitely recommend doing it anyway because the emails are so much fun! My vocabulary is average at best, but I often make correct guesses in these quizzes, which is very encouraging. There is always a button to learn more about the word in the quiz and just reading it will help you memorize new words and learn new things! *

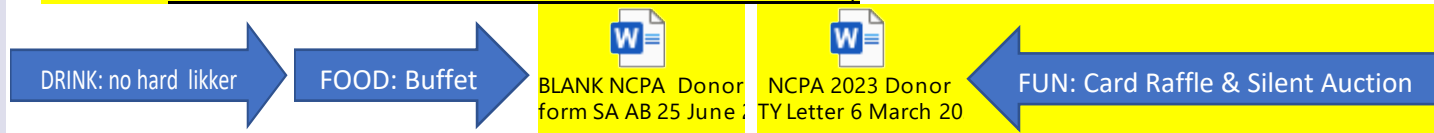

HOW BOOKS ARE JUDGED FOR AN AWARD

Important short, simplified information on judging books for the Book Awards Competition. ●

I've received a couple of questions regarding how books are **judged against each other** for the "contest" – first, this is not a *contest* with books competing against one-another for a single 1st, 2nd or 3rd place award in a genre. We can, and *have* in the past, chosen more than one book in each award category.

Rather, it's strictly a *competition*, judged by a matrix that has 10 questions with up to 5 grade examples: A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, F=1 point/s for each question. Each of the 50 answered grades is totaled at the end, then those totals are combined for a grand total which is the final numerical grade for an award. For example, if we had 10 submitted in a genre and all 10 were worthy of the same award, then we'd have 10 books awarded in a genre. Likewise, if none of those 10 are worthy, then there are zero books awarded in a genre. That also has happened in the past.

Hopefully this explains the system, and I didn't make it more confusing.Norma Jean

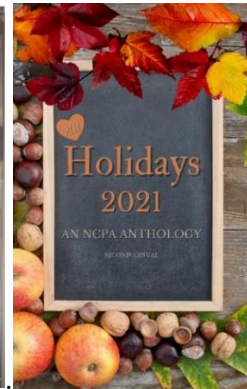
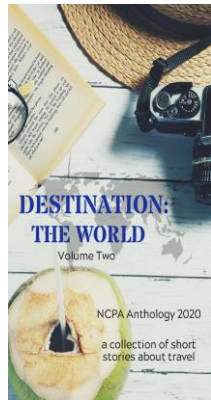
